





There was a significant main effect of political orientation (p = .03 < .05) on exploratory intentions There was no significant main effect of stimulus origin (p = .5 > .05) on exploratory intentions There was no significant interaction effect of political orientation and stimulus origin on exploratory

There was a significant main effect of political orientation (p = .01 < .05) on attitude towards the fruit There was no significant main effect of stimulus origin (p = .35 > .05) on attitude towards the fruit There was no significant interaction effect of political orientation and stimulus origin on attitude towards the

Discussion

Contrary to our hypotheses, the stimulus origin did not moderate the relationship between political orientation, exploration intentions and attitudes towards the local or foreign fruits.

Leftists and rightists did not differ in their exploration intentions and attitudes towards the fruit as a function

One limitation is that our sample was not

representative of the target population as Psychology students are generally left-oriented.

Political themes are controversial and thus social desirability could have distorted the findings. We hope future studies can address these limitations.
